I am studying here in Thunder Bay. I am in my second year of Indigenous learning. This support is making a difference because usually my parents are in Nunavut during the winter, so I need to buy food and gas. It is a struggle sometimes especially as a student. This bursary will help me a lot.

My future aspirations are to give back to Nunavut. I understand and learn about some of the struggles the Inuit face today. I would like to help in any way. I am grateful I can pursue post-secondary education, so I want to give back. I am planning to become a teacher or a counsellor. Inuit suffering with mental illness is concerning. This gives me motivation to get something out of school and motivate me to excel.
