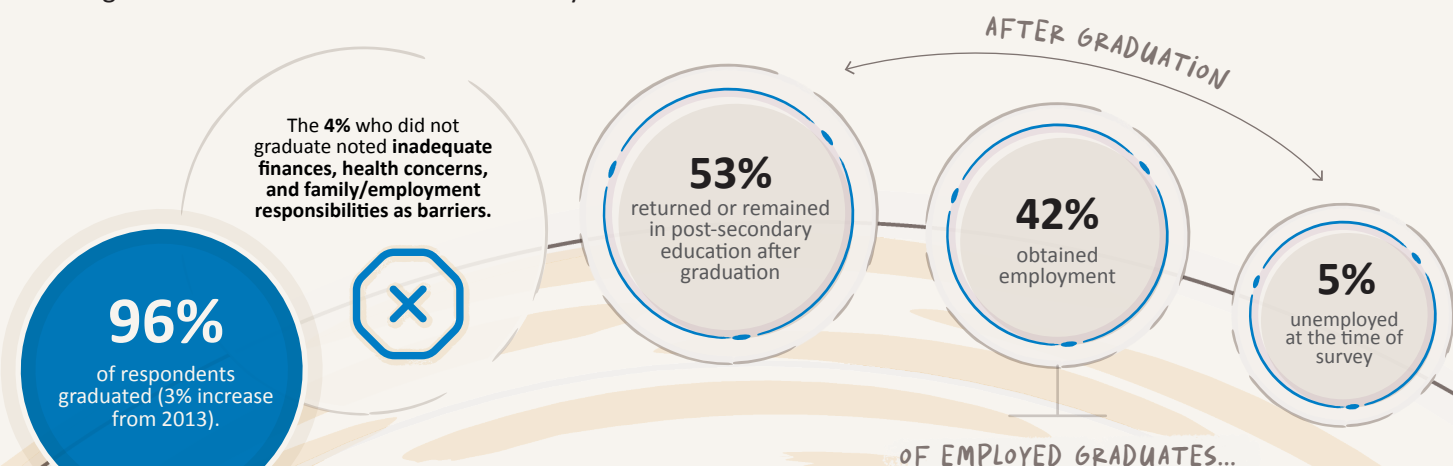




# Building Brighter Futures Graduate Outcomes

This study seeks to examine graduation rate trends, barriers to graduation and successful graduation outcomes, looking at 2014-2015 & 2015-2016 academic years.



## LEVELS OF STUDY ATTAINED



- **46.3%** – Undergraduate degrees
- **21.9%** – Diplomas
- **18.4%** – Certificates
- **8.2%** – Master's degrees
- **1.4%** – Graduate degrees
- **1.1%** – High school diplomas

## OF EMPLOYED GRADUATES...

- **74%** secured full-time work and **26%** part-time work.
- **61%** of employed graduates indicated they were **servicing Indigenous populations.**

## → What's the takeaway?

BBF recipients are graduating at high rates, with many continuing on to further post-secondary education and many employed graduates servicing Indigenous populations. Together, these outcomes point to the value of sustained support for Indigenous students.
